

Southard House Museum Re-opening: Celebrating Richmond's History



This antique toy ice wagon harkens back to the late 1800s, when Kennebec Ice was harvested for use in homes around the world.

After months of preparation for the Southard House Museum's grand re-opening on Richmond Days, the new exhibits are nearly completed. Many area residents remember when the museum first opened in 1990, but few know the story behind its origins.

The idea took root in 1985, when lifetime Richmond resident Wilber Cooper was diagnosed with leukemia. He was given just 7 years to live. Wilber refused medical treatment, and requested that his illness be kept confidential as long as possible. His energy soon began to lag, and he felt depressed and useless. But Wilber was always motivated by his love of the town. Thus began the family's efforts to develop the museum, where he could share his enthusiasm and knowledge of Richmond history with others. Wilber's work at the Southard House gave him a new lease on life, for he lived another

21 years, to age 90. The museum was closed after his passing in 2006. After many requests from the community, the museum will reopen with an exciting new outlook and multimedia exhibits.

The Open House will be held on Saturday, July 27, 10:00-4:00. To help kick off this venture, archaeologist and author Bruce Bourque will give a presentation on the Red Paint Culture at 2:00 in the Gallery of the Victorian home, which faces Main Street. We hope you join us then!

Richmond Making Strides to Become Most Walkable Community

Merrymeeting Rail Trail: Richmond Segment

Imagine a safe path in Richmond, free from car traffic, which can transport your children from home to school to downtown. A place to do some power-walking after work, or meet up with friends for an early morning walk or bike ride. This vision is a bit closer to being reality. We were recently informed that our proposal to construct bicycle and pedestrian trail from High Street to Lincoln Street, a one-mile stretch alongside the railroad corridor, was approved by MaineDOT for future design and construction funding. The Richmond Village project was one of only a handful chosen from over 90 applicants to be placed in the State's approved projects list. The Richmond project was also the only off-road major trail project that got awarded statewide. It will move forward into design

Gardiner Street Sidewalk and Trail to High School

The design for our project to construct a Gardiner Street sidewalk (from Pleasant to High Street) and trail from High Street to the High School was approved by MaineDOT. We are still awaiting news about when we will get construction funding, but remain hopeful that this project can happen this summer. Stay tuned!



Looking for a walking trail outside of the downtown? Did you know there is a Town Forest in Richmond? The forest was acquired by the Town in 1936. It is in

the southwest corner of town near Richmond Corner, and can be accessed from the Dingley Road, about 4/10 miles south of the intersection with Post Road and Route 138. There is also a smaller parking area on the Post Road. A loop trail for walking has been cut around the inside perimeter of the forest, skirting wetlands, which is clearly marked with pink tape hanging from branches. The trail is about 2 ½ miles long. There are no "facilities" and sneakers or light boots are recommended.

A Trails and Conservation Group, which always welcomes new members, has been meeting monthly to plan and promote recreational areas throughout Richmond. The Town would like to thank community volunteers Richard Gower and Wayne Ladner in particular, who have been clearing the Town Forest trail. The group hopes to have a "Grand Reopening" of the Town Forest sometime in early fall. Please contact Victoria Boundy for more information: 737-4305 x331 or director@richmondmaine.com

Help Keep Richmond Clean!

The Richmond Waterfront Park is a beautiful place for boating and picnicking. When using these facilities, please make sure you throw away all your trash in the proper receptacles, clean up after your dogs and use the comfort station respectfully.

No animals should be allowed in the restrooms. Peacock Beach is carry-in/carry-out, so please make sure you take all trash with you when you leave. Do not use the barbecue pits to dispose of your trash. They are there for you to enjoy! Peacock Beach Fees are \$3. /Adult, \$2. /

Children, \$30. / Season pass. Several trash containers are located around Lane Field for your use as well. If you see someone abusing or vandalizing town property please be sure to contact the Richmond Police Department at 737-8518. Please be sure to express the importance of keeping our town clean and healthy to your children, visiting family and friends.



Clean-Up Your Dog Waste

The Town of Richmond Animal Control Ordinance states that no person shall allow any dog owned and/or under control to defecate upon a public street, road, sidewalk, park, or other public property within the Town of Richmond. In order to help keep this situation under control the Town has put in place Waste Stations.

These waste stations have been placed at Lane Field and the Waterfront Park to assist in keeping our parks clean for all to use!

Fines will be issued to any person who violates any provision of the Animal Control Ordinance, plus the costs and expenses of prosecution including, but not limited to, the Town’s attorney fees and expenses, and the salaries and wages of Town personnel involved in investigating, preparing, and prosecuting such violation.



CODE ENFORCEMENT BY: James Valley

Summer is finally here and with no snow it is time to clean up the debris that might have collected over the long winter months. It is our job to keep our town looking as beautiful as possible. Worried about where to take all of that built up material? Look no further than the Richmond Holding Area. Open Wednesday 12-6 and Saturday 9-3.

Article 5 Section X Storage of Materials:

All materials stored outdoors shall be stored in such a manner as to prevent the breeding and harboring of insects, rats or other vermin. This shall be accomplished by enclosures in containers, raising materials above ground, separation of material, prevention of stagnant water, extermination procedures or other means. Exposed nonresidential storage areas, exposed

machinery, and areas used for the storage or collection of discarded automobiles, auto parts, metals or other articles of salvage or refuse shall have sufficient setbacks and screenings (such as a stockade fence or a dense evergreen hedge) to provide a visual buffer sufficient to minimize their impact on abutting residential uses and users or public streets.


