I-295 Northbound Project Underway



Maine DOT is preparing for the closing of I-295 Northbound, and paving the way for a safer drive.

Starting June 15, 2009
and continuing through
August, 2009, I-295

northbound from Topsham to Gardiner will be closed for rehabilitation.

Northbound traffic will be rerouted onto the newly rehabilitated southbound lanes, and southbound drivers can take Route 201 or the Maine Turnpike.

You may have already noticed that they are getting ready. If you travel between Brunswick and Gar-

diner, portions of lanes will be closed for bridge and culvert repairs, as well as paving, from now until the full closure begins in June. For more information please visit the States website at:

The snows have melted and the dry windy weather has helped dry out the soil early. The 2009 building season is here! The Town of Richmond Public Works Department has removed the posted road signs.

Please be sure to contact the Coder Officer before you start any new projects on your property. I always look forward to talking with you about your plans to ensure you will be in compliance.

The Town of Richmond needs to update the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance to be consistent with the "new" Mandatory Shoreland Zoning Guidelines adopted by the Maine DEP. As required by State Law, if the town fails to approve the new mandatory guidelines at Town meeting, the State of Maine will enact it for the Town through a legislative vote. Some changes that will occur include the flood-

plain along rivers and great ponds must now be zoned Resource Protection, the 30% expansion rule for non-conforming structures will now change to be the "alternative to the 30% expansion", and lastly the Timber Harvesting rules will now be enforced by both the Town of Richmond and the State of Maine Dept. of Conservation division of forestry.

The Land Use Ordinance has also been under review and some changes are being made to this ordinance, which will be before you at Town Meeting. The mobile home exclusion will encompass the entire village zone and mobile homes older than 15 years will not be allowed to come into Richmond nor will they be able to be moved to another lot in Town. The Commercial uses table has been expanded to include more commercial uses such as Automobile Sales, Manufacturing,

Wholesale Service and Retail Establishments, . This expanded table would require a commercial use that changes from one listed use to another use would require a Change of Use / Development Review permit issued by the Planning Board.

If you have any questions or would like to know more about any of these proposed changes please contact me at the Town office. Public Hearings will be held by the Planning Board to ensure that public input is heard. Please be sure to attend these public hearings, and Town meeting in June!

Important Information-Dog Waste Clean-UP!



In 2004 the Town of Richmond amended the Animal Control Ordinance to state that no person shall allow any dog owned and/or under control to defecate upon a public street, road, sidewalk, park, or other public property within the Town of Richmond, or upon private prop-

erty within the village district as defined on the Town Zoning Map (except for property owned by the owner of the dog) unless such feces is immediately removed and disposed of in a sanitary manner in a proper waste receptacle by said owner or controller of the dog. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon adjudication, be fined not less than \$10.00 for the first of-

fense, and not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$200.00 for each subsequent offense, plus the costs and expenses of prosecution including but not limited to the Town's attorney's fees and expenses, and the salaries and wages of Town personnel involved in investigating, preparing, and prosecuting such violation. All such fines, fees, costs and expenses shall be paid to the Town of Richmond.
